Special Vestry

We will be holding a special meeting of Vestry on **Sunday, September 14**th following the 10am service. We are seeking Vestry approval for plans to renovate the Parish Hall and for the budget (costs to be covered from Cemetery income). Our Cemetery Manager who is overseeing the project will be presenting architectural and financial details. This will be a fairly short meeting about only this issue. We ask that all who are able to attend plan to do so.

Outside Waterproofing of Church Walls

The work on the waterproofing of the outside walls of the church to prevent further water penetration has been completed. Excavated soil cannot be tamped down with machines out of concern of damaging the church's foundation, so we must let it settle naturally over the winter. New sod will be applied in the spring.



Inside Work in the basement


The work on the inside of the basement has also been started. This involved demolition of the old floor tiles and removal of all carpet. The floor was then leveled to accommodate new tiles that will be put in it's place. You will see an example of the new tile inside the back door (main entrance). The same tile will be used throughout the downstairs rooms and hallway with special water -sealant beneath to prevent moisture. The tile will be easier to clean and maintain than carpet, especially with a lot of foot traffic.

Significant mold was found in all the walls up to 3 feet above the floor. Affected sections were removed and new drywall was put in. The walls will be repainted and new, modern crown moulding placed in the large meeting room.

This will make our downstairs choir room, servers room and meeting room cleaner and healthier for all who use them.







Carillon and Bell Tower

After squirrels damaged the wiring of the electronic carillon, it was discovered that the supports for the 150 year old church bell had seriously deteriorated, making it possible for the bell to come crashing down.

Over the last two months, the bell tower itself has been cleaned out of debris, sealed against birds and animals getting in, new wiring for the carillon and new speakers installed, and new supports for the church bell built. As of Sunday, September 7th all the bells of St John's will be is use again – the church bell tolling on Sunday and the carillon playing hymns at 12pm and 6pm every day.

Sunday School – Sept 7

Our children's program resumes Sunday September 7th at the 10:00 a.m. under the leadership of our new Children's Minister, Sharon Thongom.

Sharon will be introducing a new curriculum that follows the scripture lessons being read and preached on in church, so that families will all be receiving lessons on similar themes on the same Sunday. The new curriculum involves lessons, crafts and video elements.

There will be a meeting for all families involved in the program to outline the program and discuss expectations. if you are involved or interested in assisting with the Children's Ministry, please attend the meeting on **Sunday**, **September 7 at approximately 11:30 a.m. in the Parish Hall.**
