Announcements for March/ April 2025



Vestry

On behalf of the Corporation of St. John's, thank you to everyone who attended the vestry meeting on Sunday February 23rd and who supplied food for the potluck before the meeting. It was enjoyed and greatly appreciated. Vestry and "special vestry" meetings (which are occasionally called when a decision needs to be made by the whole body of the church) are vitally important for the running of the church. They are opportunities for church members to offer feedback and ask questions. We encourage all members of the parish to attend these annual meetings, either in person or online.

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper

The church will be holding our annual Shrove Tuesday Pancake supper on Tuesday, March 4th between 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Tickets are available at church or at the door. The cost is \$10.00 per person or \$25.00 per family. Please purchase your tickets ahead of time, so that we have a count to purchase food by. We have people selling tickets at both services and you may call the church office to have tickets put aside for you to pick up. It is helpful to know how many to prepare for, so if you can please purchase tickets in advance.



Ash Wednesday

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday which falls on March 5th this year. We will be holding a service at our usual time of 10 a.m. service with a small bible study following the service for those who wish to participate. There will also be an evening service at 7:00 p.m. (with music). Ashes will be available at both services. Both services will be livestreamed. **Ash Wednesday is considered a day of obligation for Anglicans.**



Leaflets to say Morning and Evening Prayer at home will be available again for those who wish to make the Daily Office a part of their Lenten discipline. These will also be available on our website under both the Wednesday services and Sunday service bulletins.

Lenten Vespers

Vespers will be held on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. in the church each Wednesday in Lent until April 16th. This year, the focus of the Lenten Vespers will be the Seven Deadly Sins. (We begin Ash Wednesday, Mar 5th with Pride, the first sin, and finish with Tenebrae, on Wednesday of Holy Week, Apr16.) We will be livestreaming these services each week.

Discretionary Funds

Our neighbourhood includes many people who are without permanent shelter. Many of these people come to us for support, seeking help with food, clothing and other needed items. One of the best ways to help is through gift cards which can be used for various items. No-Frills (grocery), Walmart and Shoppers Drug Mart are all places where people can most easily purchase needed items. Donation of gift cards, as well as any monetary donations, are added to your offering for the year, for which you will receive a tax receipt.

Donating to the church

We have many options in order to ensure your contributions get to the church when you can't. We do accept e-transfers now. You just have to use the email address of church@stjohnsdixie.com There is no need for a password as we have auto deposit. You can also donate through Canada Helps there is charge for administrative fees taken off your donation. Their website is www.canadahelps.org or you can use the QR code provided. Of course, you can always mail in the offering at St. John's Anglican Church, 719 Dundas Street East, Mississauga, ON L4Y 2B5.



Par Program

Another option for people in Canada, would be to enroll in the PAR (preauthorized receipts) Program, there is a one – time sign up form available through email or picked up from the office. We deduct the amount you specify on the 20th of the month. The amount can be changed or cancelled at any point with just a phone call or email to the office. We are happy to assist you in setting this up.

E-Transfer/ Canada Help

Please keep in mind that if you are in the locate area a donation to us through e-transfer means that we receive all your donation. If you donate through Canada Help, they apply 4% of your donation to administration fees. When you donate by e-transfer you will receive from the church an acknowledgement of receipt of the transfer, and we will provide a tax receipt at the end of the year as well. We appreciate some people may not be comfortable with e-transfers, but we wanted you to be aware of the charge. We appreciate all donations however they are sent to us.

Lenten Messy Church

For parents and the young at heart, we will be holding Messy Church on Sunday, March 9th at 11:30 a.m. in the Parish Hall. The focus will be on Lent and our journey to Holy Week. Fr. Palm Sunday

We will be holding a special Palm Sunday Service in the Magnolia Room (Cemetery Chapel) for the 10 a.m. service. A youth choir from the UK, which is touring Ontario that week, will be joining us for their final stop before departing for home on Sunday evening. We will be holding a potluck luncheon following the service to thank them and to begin Holy Week with a celebratory time of fellowship. Please plan on attending to be part of this wonderful start to the most important week in our church calendar.

Stations of the Cross and Garden Watch - April 17th – following the Maundy Thursday eucharist, Fr. Daniel will lead people through the Stations of the Cross while the sanctuary remains open for quiet prayer and meditation until 11:45pm.

Compline will be prayed just before midnight.

Open Door



Each month, we are collecting for either the Open Door or the Food Bank Mississauga. Each month we alternate between the two, **March is Open Door.**

The **Open Door** services clients who are women, men and children. The Open Door is currently looking for winter coats of every size, warm mittens, gloves and boots. They also are in need of warm sweaters, sleeping bags, blankets, hoodies, pants and thermal wear like long johns. We can use all sizes and especially large, extra-large and above. All undamaged clothing items are accepted; t-shirts, pajamas and casual clothes, prom dresses, work clothes, belts, purses and footwear are also appreciated. They also accept children's books and personal hygiene items like deodorant, body wash, pads, baby and adult diapers.

Daylight Savings Time

Our clocks will be springing forward Sunday, March 8th, so please remember to put your clock **forward one hour before bed on the Saturday**, so you are not late for church on Sunday.



Palm Cross Making

The church will be making Palm Crosses on Friday, April 11th at 1:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall. If you would like to come and join in on the fun and fellowship you are encouraged to. There will be instructions on how to make them, so you don't have to have previous knowledge. We do however ask that you bring your own scissors as we don't supply them.
