## The Collect of the Day

in your Holy Name.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. #### The Nicene Creed




### **▼** The Celebration of the Eucharist


Gracious God, his perfect sacrifice destroys the power of sin and death; by raising him to life you give us life for evermore. Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith.


## All: Christ has died Christ is Risen. Christ will come again.

The following is said by the Priest and those worshipping with us online.


