
All: Amen.






▼ The Celebration of the Eucharist

Priest: Source of all life, the heaven and earth are yours, yet you have given us dominion over all things. Receive the symbols of our labour and love which we offer you this day, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

Priest: Holy God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal: you we praise and glorify, you we worship and adore. You formed the earth from chaos; you encircled the globe with air; you created fire for warmth and light; you nourish the lands with water. Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the holy people who have served you in every age, we raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.

Priest: If you are joining us from home, join us in this act of Eucharist by offering with me this prayer for Spiritual Communion.


The following is said by the Priest and those worshipping with us online.
